1980, wood is probably cherry. This is a beautiful well-maintained Loomcraft floor loom that is in excellent condition.

The loom belonged to my friend Roy's Mom – he writes: My mother was an active weaver in eastern Pennsylvania throughout the 1980s and early 1990s. At one time she was even processing new sheep's wool from a friend's farm near Hopewell Furnace, PA. She continued to weave, although on a less frequent basis, when they moved to Danville, Kentucky in 1994. While not as active from 2001, Mom continued to weave until last summer. There is a small piece of work 'in progress' on the loom. Mom's health declined during the fall and winter of 2008 and 2009, and she passed away at 88 in February 2009.

Included in this package: one vertical table warping mill, one medium warping board, single end hand bobbin winder, numerous reeds, numerous warp sticks, bobbins, boat shuttles, shuttles, numerous cones of single ply wool, bundles of chenille, assorted spools of linen (?), assorted spools of cotton, and several years of Handweaver Magazine – loose and more that I am certain I missed.

These looms are located in Danville, Kentucky and the purchaser is responsible for relocating the looms. Danville, KY is twenty minutes from the Pleasant Hill Shaker Museum – a wonderful place to visit!
